Math for your ears!

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


Vocabulary review: Time Signature: It tells you how the music should be counted.

Measure: A specific number of beats defined by the time signature.

Bar Line: A vertical straight line between measures.

<u>Example:</u>



Answer page: (Part 1.)



1) You just heard 6 measures.

2) There were 8 beats in each measure.

3) So there were 48 beats altogether in the whole piece.


Explanation : 6 groups of 8 beats = 48 beats 6 * 8 = 48

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Create you own music game!


Here is how:

- "So how many beats were there altogether in the whole piece?"

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


Hand Signs
